## Andrews Federal Credit Union Makes a \$5,000 Donation to NJ Run for the Fallen

**Suitland, MD (July 15, 2009)** – Andrews Federal Credit Union made a \$5,000 donation to the “New Jersey Run for the Fallen” event scheduled for August 22 – 23, 2009. During the event, a team of 24 active-duty and reserve service members from McGuire AFB and Ft. Dix (NJ) will run from Cape May, NJ to Holmdel, NJ in honor of fallen service members. The runners will mark each mile with an American flag and sign card in remembrance of New Jersey soldiers, airmen, sailors, and marines killed in Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom.

All proceeds raised from the event will be donated to the Gold Star Mother’s National Monument being built in Washington, DC. This monument acknowledges mothers who have lost a child in active duty.
